Dress Code Issues Being Addressed at Tecumseh

The administration and staff of TJSHS are emphasizing the need of our students to dress appropriately in our building. Boys will not be able to wear sagging or low-riding pants. Girls will be required to keep the top of their shirt/blouse a credit card length from their collarbone. Both boys and girls wearing shorts will adhere to the same credit

card length from the top of their knees. As always, no body piercings or spacers will be allowed other than in the ear. Inappropriate or suggestive language or pictures on clothing is also not permitted. These are the main issues that we addressed with the student body on the first day of school. First time offenders will receive 2 demerits and subsequent offenses will result in suspensions.
